

**GENERATOR CERTIFICATION LETTER

The generator certifies that only clean construction and demolition debris shall be delivered to the Heartland Recycling - Aurora CCDD, LLC site for disposal. Clean construction and demolition debris is defined as follows:

Clean construction or demolition debris -- uncontaminated broken concrete without protruding metal bars, bricks, rock, stone, reclaimed asphalt pavement or soil generated from construction or demolition activities. Oversize concrete, > 2' x 2', and concrete with protruding rebar will be stockpiled for crushing and recycling.

Prior to delivery of materials to the site, the generator will meet all requirements of the current regulations concerning clean construction and demolition debris, including having on file the appropriate LPC-662, or LPC-663 AND TACO Tier I Comparison Table.

One Form LPC-662 or LPC-663 must be on file for each project and/or each separate site prior to delivery of any material to the CCDD facility. Material may not be unloaded at the site without prior approval.

The generator certifies that no unacceptable wastes will be delivered to the Heartland Recycling - Aurora CCDD, LLC site. Wastes that cannot be accepted include any of the following:

1. Landscape Waste -- all accumulations of grass or shrubbery cuttings, leaves, tree limbs and other materials accumulated as the result of the care of lawns, shrubbery, vines and trees.
2. Municipal Waste -- garbage, general household and commercial waste, industrial lunchroom or office waste, landscape waste, and general construction or demolition debris.
3. Pollution Control Waste -- any liquid, solid, semi-solid, or gaseous waste generated as a direct or indirect result of the removal of contaminants from the air, water, or land, and which pose a present or potential threat to human health or to the environment or with inherent properties which make the disposal of such waste in a landfill difficult to manage by normal means. "Pollution Control Waste" includes, but is not limited to, water and wastewater treatment plant sludges, baghouse dusts, landfill waste, scrubber sponges, and chemical spill cleaning waste.
4. Sludge -- any solid, semi-solid, or liquid waste generated from a municipal, commercial, or industrial wastewater treatment plant, water supply treatment plant, or air pollution control facility, or any other waste having similar characteristics and effects.

5. Special Waste -- any industrial process waste, pollution control waste, or hazardous waste, except as defined in Section 22.9 of the Environmental Protection Act. "Special Wastes" also means any potentially infectious medical waste or asbestos containing material.
6. Waste -- any garbage, sludge from a waste treatment plant, water supply treatment plant, or air pollution control facility or other discarded material, including solid, liquid, semi-solid, or contained gaseous material resulting from industrial, commercial, mining and agricultural operations, and from community activities.
7. Landfill Waste -- waste from a closed pollution control facility, closed dumping site, closed sanitary landfill, or a closed waste disposal site.
8. Coal Combustion Waste -- any fly ash, bottom ash, slag, and/or flue gas or fluid bed boiler de-sulfurization by-products generated as a result of the combustion of coal or coal in combination with certain other products.
9. Industrial Process Waste -- any liquid, solid, semi-solid, or gaseous waste generated as a direct or indirect result of the manufacture of a product or the performance of a service.
10. Household Waste -- any solid waste (including garbage, trash, and sanitary wastes in septic tanks) derived from households (including single and multiple residences, hotels and motels, bunkhouses, ranger stations, crew quarters, campgrounds, picnic grounds, and day-use recreation areas).
11. Hazardous Waste -- a waste, or combination of wastes, which because of its quantity, concentration, or physical, chemical, or infectious characteristics may cause or contribute to an increase in mortality or an increase in serious, irreversible, or incapacitating reversible illness; or pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, or disposed of, or otherwise managed, and which has been identified by characteristics or listing as hazardous.
